

Musical Hydrotherapy Training Programme

Liquid Listening provides training to practitioners, teachers, staff, carers and parents to enable organisations to facilitate Musical Hydrotherapy themselves and integrate it successfully into their curriculum or rehabilitation programmes.

The training ensures that the therapy delivered is of a quality and standard that encourages the ongoing development and welfare of therapy participants. It also provides a unique professional and personal development opportunity which fosters relationships between facilitators and beneficiaries

The benefits of Music Hydrotherapy include:

- Increased motor and sensory skills
- Improved communication
- Increased appreciation to sound and music
- Increased attention in the classroom
- A deeper state of relaxation



WHAT'S INCLUDED?

Full CPD training for up to 10 staff members in the pool, with an option to increase by groups of 10 for little extra cost

Music in the Pool workshops with music teacher or, in their absence, with class teachers could be involved in accreditation (Asdan/formal targets) or go towards targets on a Childs EHCP.

Free annual membership to Liquid Listening service hub including free refresher training sessions, maintenance of equipment, consultation with our practitioners, refreshed playlist, invitations to opportunities.

Training Programme Overview

- Delivered over six 4-hour sessions by a trained aquatic body therapy practitioner and sound/audio specialist.
- Up to 21 participants per group 10 trainees at the pool, 10 recipients and music teacher (this number depends on pool size).
- Covers techniques in supporting people in water taken from Watsu and Craniosacral therapy and consultation on floatation aids that best serve the purpose.

- Includes installation of a specialist underwater sound system and training to operate and troubleshoot the equipment.
- Reviewing of participant progress.
- Consultation sessions with the music therapy teachers on ways to create and integrate classroom work with pool work and expand the role of music work in the school.
- Provides opportunities to connect and share best practice with other Liquid Listening partner organisations and the wider Musical Hydrotherapy community
- Can be flexibly delivered to suit curriculum/organizational needs and opportunities

Programme Outcomes

- Between 8 10 trained staff members per group, with CPD certificates for Musical Hydrotherapy practice
- At least ten students benefitting from Musical Hydrotherapy during the training
- A suggested protocol for the school and guidance to music staff and teaching staff on how to deliver musical hydrotherapy sessions based on needs
- Highest quality underwater speaker system imported at wholesale price, installed and operational
- Provision of hours of music to play underwater, continuous support and sharing of practice

Introductory Meeting

Content: Training staff members in MH supporting techniques.

Day 2 09:00 - 13:00

10 school staff members.

School music teacher/s.

LV aquatic bodywork practitioner.

LV sound practitioner.

School IT manager.

Content:

- Staff work in pairs in the pool on MH techniques to underwater music.
- Music teachers join the session as recipients.
- IT manager understands the setup of the underwater sound system and we discuss the permanent installation on site.

Classroom teachers who went through the MH training Music teacher LV Music practitioner ** Classroom students

Content:

Meeting with teachers and outlining the workshop - 2hrs Working in the classrooms

** LV music teacher and school music teacher meet to review ways in which the music provision at the school can be integrated with the MH practice.

Day 6 09:30 - 14:45 Refresher

Hydrotherapy pool

Participants:

10 school staff members.

Schoolchildren.

School music teacher/s.

LV aquatic bodywork practitioner.

LV sound practitioner.

LV music teacher.

Content: Refresher session.

- LV staff respond to challenges encountered by school staff in the first few weeks of assimilating MH at the school.
- Final evaluation meeting to be held with project lead and trained staff, reviewing progress of participants, and evidence collated.
- Reviewing school/organisation implementation strategy for Musical Hydrotherapy.

Cost

The cost breaks down to £135 per course participant per session.

The training would take 6 mornings for 10 staff members plus a morning and two 90min meetings for the music teacher.

The equipment and its installation costs come to £2400.

The total for all training, equipment and all of the above comes to £8500. Payment schedule can be negotiated on a case basis.
